LEAD

- Establish permanent support for United Way's 211 community resource helpline to ensure consistent and reliable access to statewide services.
- Increase access to safe, affordable housing for populations at highest risk of homelessness
- Increase access to affordable, traumasensitive, culturally responsive childcare while supporting a sustainable and diverse workforce..
- Support the growth of an equitable food system transforming how food is produced, distributed, and consumed to promote thriving, healthy communities.

UPPOR

- Increase access to wealth-building opportunities for families and individuals by ensuring sustainable funding to support affordable housing, economic stability and career pathways.
- Empower young people/youth by equipping them with the necessary resources to complete high school and prepare them for well-paying, high demand careers through career pathways and high quality out-of-school programs.

AMPLIFY

- Increase access to and availability of mental health services for individuals, children and families, including the 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline, while ensuring cultural representation in the workforce.
- Enhance collaboration between community organizations and government to ensure a strong nonprofit sector.
